No more than 43% of students in grades K-5 will score in Tier 3 by Spring ELA AIMsweb Plus, as evidenced by the grade level composite score.

- At least 62% of students will attend school 95% of days or more.

- At least 15% of students in grades 4-8 will score at Proficient or Advanced on the Math PSSA (includes PASA).

- No more than 50% of students in grades 4-8 will score at Below Basic on the Math PSSA (includes December 18, 2017 PASA).

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Robert Morris will:

1. Hold Parent-Teacher Conferences in November, February, and April. The 4th Report Card will be sent home with students.

2. Provide a minimum of four Parent Workshops such as the Parent Cafe and Crayola Writing workshops

3. Teachers will provide parents in a newsletter with different literacy and math strategies they can work on at home with their child. For example, a sight words list, math problems, or reading fluency passages.

4. Increase parent attendance at school events, such as back to school night with incentives

5. Provide intervention opportunities for students that parents can help monitor or support

Attend Back to School Night and other school events, such as Parent Teacher Conferences and parent workshops, with consistency

Support my child with the completion of their homework on a consistent basis.

Read 3-4 times a week with my child utilizing a book or text of their choice 4. Utilize resources from the classroom newsletter to support my child with their learning, such as a sight word list. Support intervention programs that the teacher provides to my child.

- 3. Make sure to complete my classwork in a timely manner
- 4. Complete the intervention program provided to me by my teacher
